

Standardised Price List September 2021

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services, to help you thin through your options and make choices, and to let you compare prices between different funeral directors.

Attended Funeral (funeral director's charges only)	
This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as their burial or cremation	£1990.00
Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements	£735.00
Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 5 miles of the funeral director's branch premises)	£265.00
Care for the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased person will be kept at the funeral directors premises	£270.00
Providing a coffin suitable for burial or cremation – this will be made from chipboard with real wood veneer covering	£325.00
Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends, by appointment with the funeral directors	No charge
At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased person direct to your choice of cemetery or crematorium (which can be up to 20 miles from the funeral directors premises)	£395.00

Unattended Funeral	
This is a funeral where family and friends choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at a later date and not at the same time as their burial or cremation	
Burial (funeral director's charges only)	£850.00
Cremation (funeral director's charges plus cremation fee)	£1400.00

Fees you must pay	
For and attended or unattended burial funeral, the burial fee . ¹	£708.00

For a new grave, you will also need to buy the plot; for an existing grave with a memorial in place, you will also need to pay for a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.	£3000.00

¹ This fee (which is sometime called the interment or internment fee) is the charge made for digging a new grave, or for reopening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you may also need to pay a Medical Referee (doctor's) Fee.
